POLL WORKERS NEEDED

FOR THE NOVEMBER 5TH ELECTION

There is nothing more important to democracy than free and fair elections. By becoming a poll worker, you will help ensure that all registered voters are able to exercise their right to vote freely, without obstruction or influence. As an Election Day poll worker, you will work with a team, and each team member will have their own important role.

Together, you will help the Town of Winthrop have a successful and efficient Election Day. Election Day poll workers will be paid for their day of service to the Town.

ELECTION DAY POLL WORKER RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- Help in the setup of the voting location on Election Day.
- Prevent interference with the voting process and assist voters in accordance with the law.
- Check voters in, hand out ballots, and direct voters to voting stations.
- Help voters who may have difficulties voting due to sight and physical limitations.
- Oversee the completion of forms for challenged and provisional ballots.
- Read and record the number of ballots case before, during and at the close of the polls.
- Help with various assignments required to secure the closing of the polls.

STREET SWEEPING NEXT WEEK

Street Sweeping operations occur on the last full week of the month (last week with a Friday) from April through October between 7am and 4pm on the day of a street's trash collection. If there is a holiday on the week of street sweeping, sweeping is done one week early. Town ordinance prohibits on-street parking on the day of sweeping. Violation of the ordinance carries a \$40 fine, and your vehicle can be towed.

The 2024 street sweeping dates are:

- April 22-26 (week of the 22nd)
- June 24-28 (week of the 24th)
- August 26-30 (week of the 26th)
- October 21-25 (week of the 21st)
- May 22-24 (week of the 20th)
- July 22-26 (week of the 22nd)
- September 23-27 (week of the 23rd)





What is Green Waste? Green waste is yard waste which is banned from regular trash collection. This waste includes grass, leaves, vines, hedge trimmings, and small to medium-sized branches under 3" in diameter. Root balls and branches over three inches are not accepted. Other wastes, such as rocks, plastic, construction material, trash, or animal waste cannot be mixed with green waste.






